The Board of Pondera County Commissioners met daily in informal session and in scheduled meetings on August 7, 14, 21, and 28, 2024.

AUGUST 7, 2024 REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSION:

LAND ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE & SERVICES – PHASE 1

Commissioner Drishinski moved and Commissioner Kuka seconded the approval of the Land Acquisition Assistance & Services Phase 1 with Robert Peccia & Associates Inc. The total engineering fee will be \$27,400.00. Motion carried.

APPOINTMENT OF COUNTY TAX APPEAL BOARD MEMBER

Commissioner Kuka moved and Commissioner Drishinski seconded for appointing Trina Jo Bradley to the County Tax Appeal Board. Motion carried.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM AMENDMENT

ALLOWING BALLOT ISSUE TO LEVY TAXES ON ALL PROPERTY OWNERS
IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE COUNTY OWNED HOSPITAL
BUILDING

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners has received a request from the Board of Directors of Logan Health - Conrad to place a levy request on the November 5, 2024 ballot; and

WHEREAS the deadline to submit ballot issue language to the County Election Administrator is August 14, 2024; and

WHEREAS the Hospital voted levy passed by voters in 2014 in the amount of \$175,000 per year, plus an inflationary factor as allowed by Montana law, expired in tax year 2024. In the tax year 2024 the levy generated approximately 12.45 mills, \$253,341. The Logan Health-Conrad Board of Directors request that the voters of Pondera County be given the opportunity to approve or disapprove a continuation of the levy, beginning with tax year 2025 for a period of eight (8) years, for the purpose of funding needed imminent and future infrastructure and capital needs for the county-owned hospital and long-term care building leased to Logan Health.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners that a ballot issue be placed on the November 5, 2024 ballot in order that the voters may approve or disapprove continuation of the current voted levy for a period of eight (8) years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, subject to the approval of the Pondera County Clerk and Recorder and County Attorney, the form on the ballot shall be as follows:

COUNTY-OWNED HOSPITAL AND NURSING HOME BUILDING MILL LEVY

Shall the Pondera County Board of County Commissioners be authorized to levy sufficient mills, being approximately 12.45, to generate \$253,341 plus an inflationary factor allowed by Montana law, for a period of eight (8) years, beginning with tax year 2025, for the purpose of funding needed imminent and future infrastructure and capital needs for the county-owned hospital and long-term care building leased to Logan Health.

The fiscal impact on a home having a market value of \$100,000 is estimated to be \$15.89 each year of the levy; on a home having a market value of \$300,000 is estimated to be \$47.67 each year of the levy; and on a home having a market value of \$600,000 is estimated to be \$95.34 each year of the levy. An increase in property taxes may lead to an increase in rental costs.

Additional Information: In 2014 the voters approved a levy for the purpose of funding capital equipment and/or building improvements at the county-owned building leased by

The notice of the hearing was published in The Independent-Observer and the Valerian August 8 and 15, 2024 issues.

Commissioner Morren called the hearing to review the proposed Health Insurance Premium Gap Permissive Levy & the proposed Sheriff Retirement Service Permissive Levy to order at 10:05 am at the Pondera County Commissioners office, 20 4th Ave SW, Conrad. There was no comment from the public and no written comment was received.

HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUM GAP PERMISSIVE LEVY: The County is authorized to levy up to 21.85 mills for the levy. The levying amount equals \$444,659.22. Clerk & Recorder Farkell explained that the County will most likely only levy 7.75 mills for the upcoming fiscal year.

SHERIFF RETIREMENT SERVICE PERMISSIVE LEVY: The County is authorized to levy 0.751 mills for the levy. The levying amount equals \$15,273.79. Clerk & Recorder Farkell stated that the County will most likely levy the full amount for the upcoming fiscal year.

HEARING ON FINAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-25

The notice of the hearing was published in The Independent-Observer and the Valerian August 8 and 15, 2024 issues.

Commissioner Morren called the hearing to review the proposed County budget to order at 10:11 am. at the Pondera County Commissioners office, 20 4th Ave SW, Conrad. There were no written comments were received.

The Commissioners met with department heads in May and June regarding their department requests. All areas of the budget were discussed among the Commissioners and Clerk and Recorder during the months of June, July and August, resulting in the final budget which is the subject of the hearing. Those in attendance discussed the major expenditures expected in each department, as well as the revenues to be received.

Being no further discussion, the hearing was closed at 10:30 am.

AIRPORT LEASE WITH PETER C ELLIS

Commissioner Drishinski moved and Commissioner Kuka seconded the approval of the farm lease with Peter C. Ellis. The portion of agricultural land adjoining the airport containing 1.37 acres, located next to Pondera County Airport. No rent shall be exchanged under the terms of the lease. Motion carried.

GRANTING REQUEST FOR BALLOT ISSUE TO LEVY TAXES ON ALL COUNTY
PROPERTY OWNERS IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FUNDING
FOR PONDERA COUNTY REGIONAL PORT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS the Pondera County Board of Commissioners has received requests from the Pondera County Regional Port Authority requesting that a ballot issue be placed on the November 5, 2024 primary election ballot; and

WHEREAS the deadline to submit ballot issue language to the County Election Administrator is August 14, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Pondera County Board of Commissioners that a ballot issue be placed on the November 5, 2024 ballot in order that the voters may approve or disapprove an additional mill levy of four (4) mills each year, beginning tax year 2025, for the purpose of funding the operations of the Pondera County Regional Port Authority; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the form on the ballot shall be as follows:

Shall the Pondera County Board of Commissioners be authorized to levy four (4) additional mills on all taxable property within Pondera County to generate approximately \$82,000, beginning tax year 2025, for ten (10) years, for the purpose of funding the operations of the Pondera County Regional Port Authority? This levy is not cumulative, which means the number of mills will not increase over time. This levy is in addition to any other mill levies authorized by Charter or law.

The financial impact of the total of four (4) additional mills on a home having a market value of \$100,000 is estimated to be \$5.40 each year of the levy, \$16.20 for a home having a market value of \$300,000 and \$32.40 for a home having a market value of \$600,000. An increase in property taxes may lead to an increase in rental costs.

RESOLUTION ON AUTHORIZING COST-OF-LIVING SALARY ADJUSTMENTS

WHEREAS, the Commissioners appointed the County Compensation Board and the Board met during a public hearing called by the Commissioners on June 12, 2024 and discussed several suggested compensation schedules for elected officials for FY2024/25; and

WHEREAS, the County Compensation Board recommended that compensation for elected officials in Pondera County for FY2024/25 be increased by an amount up to 4.5% cost-of-living adjustment; the recommendation was approved by the members of the Compensation Board, and

WHEREAS, the Compensation Board recommended that, in an effort to encourage more interest in serving, longevity for elected officials who do not receive longevity per 7-4-2508 (2)(a) MCA be implemented; the recommendation was approved by the members of the Compensation Board

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, effective August 26, 2024, the County will pay a cost-of-living salary adjustment of 4.5% for elected officials based on the Clerk and Recorder's base salary to be added to the salaries of Pondera County elected officials. Additional compensation of \$2,000 annually for Commissioners and Sheriff will remain at the statutory rates. Additional compensation of \$2,000 was approved for the Clerk and Recorder who also serves as Election Administrator (pursuant to 7-4-2503(d), MCA, effective October 1, 2005).

Longevity will be maxed at 12 years of service, continuing at the 12-year rate each year for the remainder of the elected official's service time.

ADOPTING THE FINAL OPERATING BUDGET AND SETTING APPROPRIATION AUTHORITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2025

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4030, MCA, provides that the governing body shall adopt the final budget by resolution. The resolution must:

- (a) Authorize appropriations to defray the expenses or liabilities for the fiscal year;
- (b) Establish legal spending limits at the level of detail in the resolution; and
- (c) Include any increase in property taxes, including an increase authorized under 15-10-420(1) and the amount by which property taxes will increase on homes valued at \$100,000, \$300,000 and \$600,000.

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4020 requires that a preliminary annual operating budget must be prepared for the local government; and

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4021 requires that the governing body shall cause a notice of public hearing on the preliminary or amended budget to be published, and

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4024, provides that the governing body must hold a public hearing in accordance with the notice given pursuant to 7-6-4021; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners held a public hearing on August 21, 2024 where residents of the County were allowed to express their concerns about the proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners has reviewed the proposed budget, received the estimated ending cash balances for all county funds, made changes to the budget as deemed necessary following the public hearing and from input by elected officials and department heads, and computed the estimated taxes, fees and assessments needed to fund the fiscal year 2025 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Pondera County that:

The final budget after any amendments to the preliminary budget and after considering any public comment is adopted.

This resolution authorizes:

- (a) Appropriations to defray the expenses or liabilities for the fiscal year.
- (b) It sets the legal spending limits at the county fund level. Fund level detail is stated in the formal budget document and established in the County's

(e) A decrease in property taxes due to (15-10-420 calculation), voted countywide levies of \$3.10, \$9.31, and \$18.63, respectively for a home valued at \$100,000, \$300,000 and \$600,000 is included in this fiscal year budget.


